Income



School fees and levies cover the schools resources, maintenance leases etc.

State and Federal funding covers 95% + of staff wages, Diversity and staff development.

Projects

The school has a 5 year project plan that includes continual maintenance, upgraded classrooms, school grounds improvements etc

On average this equates to over \$650,000 annually.



Maintenance & Expenses



Our annual maintenance schedule includes maintaining and updating items like:

Airconditioners, buildings, painting, carpert cleaning, pest control and maintaining solar panels, grounds, playgrounds, cleaning and emergency systems etc.

The school takes loans out for large projects such as IT, building, playground upgrades, solar, security etc.

This equates to over \$315,000 annually.

Utilities / Leases
