Standards of Behaviour

1. I understand that the Program requires a high level of commitment and standards of behaviour from my child. I have explained to them that during the Program, they will be required to work hard and concentrate during all activities and follow the Gondwana Choirs Code of Conduct.
2. I have read the Gondwana Choirs Code of Conduct and discussed it with my child. We agree to act in accordance with its values and expectations.

Code of Conduct

Gondwana Choirs is committed to the creation of a safe and supportive environment. To play their part in this, we ask all choristers to uphold and model the values and expectations set out in this Code of Conduct.

We expect that all Gondwana Choirs choristers:

- Commit to learning their music and performing at a high level.
- Are punctual to rehearsals and adhere to Songfest's Attendance Policy.
- Treat fellow choristers, staff, and supervisors with kindness and respect:
 - Acknowledging the rights and points of view of others
 - Being inclusive, regardless of differences in age, abilities, identity, religion, or cultural background
 - Considering their use of language and refraining from using explicit language, particularly in the presence of younger choristers.
- Promptly follow any directions given by staff or supervisors.
- Behave in a manner which is not disruptive, and which enables other choristers to learn and perform at their best.
- Take personal responsibility for safety through their behaviour and actions.
- Tell staff if they are having a problem with another chorister, staff member, or volunteer.
- Tell staff if they feel unwell.

Violence, bullying (both in person and online) or inappropriate behaviour will not be tolerated. Such misconduct may result in the chorister being removed from the Program.

Gondwana Choirs celebrates inclusion and diversity, and as such does not accept racist or discriminatory behaviour, language, or vilification. This extends to choristers' family and friends attending Gondwana Choirs events.

3. If we decide that your child is not coping with the demands of the Program or their behaviour is causing difficulties or risks for our staff, volunteers, or other choristers, we may remove your child from the Program. We will always discuss this with you first. Should this occur, you will be required to collect your child, or arrange for them to be collected at your own cost.

Medical issues and consent

4. It is important that you have fully disclosed any allergies, medical conditions or medical history which may be relevant, including with respect to food allergies and dietary requirements. You also need to tell us about any behavioural, learning, social or other issues which may be relevant to how your child engages in the Program. In running the Program and in determining the appropriate response to a medical issue, we will be entitled to assume that the information you have given us is complete and up to date. It is your responsibility to advise us of any changes when you become aware of them.
5. If your child suffers an accident or medical issue while participating in the Program, it may be necessary for us to respond, whether that be by giving paracetamol for a fever or headache or taking your child to a doctor or hospital in more serious cases. We will generally seek to contact your emergency contacts, but this may not always be possible or appropriate in advance (for example, in an emergency).
6. If a medical issue arises for you, you consent to us administering minor treatment (e.g. paracetamol, dressings for minor cuts) and organising such medical treatment (which may include surgery under anaesthetic) from appropriately qualified practitioners as we consider fit in the circumstances. In doing this, we will take into account the medical and other information (including allergies) you have notified to us.
7. You agree to pay or reimburse all costs and expenses incurred by us in responding to a medical issue affecting your child.

Name and image, copyright, intellectual property

8. We will publish your child's name in printed programs, and video credits. We seek to protect their identity and do not publish names alongside photos and other identifying information without your permission.
9. You consent to us photographing and recording (audio, video or both) your child's participation in the Program and using any such photos and recordings in our normal activities (such as concerts, special projects and promotional activities). We may post photos and recordings on digital platforms such as YouTube, Instagram, and Facebook.
10. All copyright and other intellectual property rights which are created by your child or come into existence through their participation in the Program are transferred and vest in us immediately upon creation or coming into existence. You will do anything we reasonably ask to give effect to or perfect any such transfer. Neither you nor your child will be entitled to any compensation or consideration for any such transfer or vesting.
11. If your child retains any moral rights in respect of any intellectual property rights vested in or transferred to us, we will consult with you in good faith as to any issues of attribution and integrity. However, if we don't reach agreement following consultation, you agree to not take any action against us with respect to any alleged infringement of those moral rights.

Privacy and personal information

12. You acknowledge that we need certain personal information (including medical information referred to above) in order for your child to participate in the Program. You consent to us collecting personal information about your child and using it for any purpose associated with the Program. We may disclose your child's personal information to third parties with whom we deal in administering the Program. In doing this, we will comply with all privacy laws. Risk of participation in the Program

13. To the full extent permitted by law:

- a. Gondwana Choirs, our officers and staff are not liable to you, your child or anyone else for any personal injury, illness, or any other loss you or your child may incur as a result of or in connection with your child's participation in the Program or any activities incidental to the Program.
- b. It is your responsibility to take out all appropriate insurance such as travel insurance for your child.
- c. You agree that all risks of any such injury, illness, or loss are borne by you and your child.

Attendance Policy

- 14.** I acknowledge that choristers must attend all rehearsals associated with the Program and, if they do not, they will not be eligible to participate in the Program.

Withdrawal Policy

- 15.** I understand that my enrolment in the Program commits my child to the full Program and agree to pay the corresponding fees outlined in the communication from Gondwana Choirs.
- 16.** I agree that should withdrawal from the Program be required, notice must be given in writing (via email) and I will still be liable for the Program fees.
